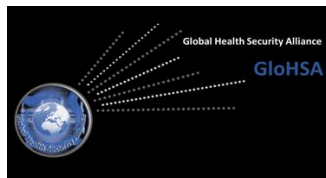

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Young Security Conference (YSC) Programme is composed of the YSC Conference and its Fellowship Programme. Two geopolitical dimensions will guide the YSC throughout the upcoming year, the Franco-German and transatlantic relationships, in addition to five thematic pillars: **Climate Security, Cyber Security, European Neighbourhood Security, Health Security, and European Sovereignty and Autonomy.**

Morning sessions on both conference days are dedicated to the **2022 YSC Fellows**, who are selected through an open application process. In a closed town hall session, diverse topics will be critically discussed to foster political innovation through intergenerational exchanges. During the sessions open to the public – both online and in-attendance – YSC Fellows will have the opportunity to present ideas, papers, and proposals, as well as to engage in discussions with high-ranking panellists.

Workshops

Following the conference, EuropaNova Germany will continue to organise both digital and in person workshops for the Fellows which expand upon the themes presented at the YSC. As this is a 'community of practice', the workshops, which are divided into two parts, are designed to facilitate scientific debate and collaborative discussion in a pedagogical format.

The YSC Fellowship will focus on a plethora of issues related to the future of Franco-German relations, European strategic autonomy, and the transatlantic alliance. During the year-long programme, Fellows will have the opportunity to present their ideas, papers, proposals, as well as to participate in discussions and exchanges with one another, leading practitioners, and academic experts.

THE STORY OF THE YSC

The European Union's uniqueness stems from its diversity, as a place in which different nationalities, cultures, languages, and backgrounds can work together as one. Hence, the people who talk and think about Europe and shaping its future should reflect this diversity. This objective, incorporating a plurality of backgrounds and perspectives in pursuit of bolstering civic engagement, has been at the core of our mission since the beginning.

Thanks to funding from the Franco-German University and the Franco-German Youth Office, the Young Security Conference (YSC) has been uniting an intergenerational audience from across Europe/the globe since 2020 to critically discuss and reflect on diverse topics related to the EU's security, defence roadmaps and recent political innovations.

With a mixture of Fellow dedicated and public sessions, participants are welcomed to challenge their academic perspectives and to network with a variety of professionals from across the spectrum of the security and development sector. Through an original, dynamic, and youthful approach to interpreting security, the YSC aims to keep up with the fast pace at which the world is changing. As stated by a former participant “[b]ringing together young security leaders, the YSC represents a new concept within the international scenario, where outstanding speakers and young researchers exchange input and work together to propose new outputs”.

Consequently, creating spaces in which Fellows can present their original work and proposals to a high-level audience lies at the heart of the YSC. Dr. Asiem El Difraoui, Co-Founder of the Candid Foundation Paris/Berlin was “[s]imply impressed by the exchanges of young participants - controversial - creative and intelligent” which resulted from this format.

2021: Furthering Our Mission under Difficult Circumstances

Due to the pandemic in 2021, the YSC adapted its traditional format to respond to restrictions on gathering. Despite being online, the YSC still brought participants together, facilitating meaningful connections and a lively exchange of ideas, through a discussion of topics of major relevance to the current state of Franco-German and European political affairs.

Panels were centred around our five pillars: *EU's Open Strategic Autonomy, Health Security, The EU and its Neighbourhood, Climate Security & the Green Deal, and Cyber Security & Digital Policies*. The 2021 conference anchored its multidisciplinary reflections on key concepts, such as the role of the West in today's global challenges and the role of the Franco-German alliance at the centre of the European integration process - an alliance which has survived a difficult decade and thus finds itself at a crossroads.

As we approach our third YSC, our network of Fellows continues to grow and contributes to our goal of promoting a Franco-German dialogue not only during but also after the conference.
